CLASSES

Flowers and Shrubs

Classes 1 – 11 are to be from the exhibitor's own garden or cultivation

1. Vase of mixed garden flowers – excludes roses & shrubs. Max. table space 40 cm
2. Vase of mixed garden shrubs – may include roses. Max. table space 50cm
3. Three heads of hydrangeas. Max. table space 60cm.
4. Three dahlias
5. One specimen rose
6. Vase of roses with three stems (can be multi-headed). Max. table space 40cm
7. A single-stemmed, single or multi-bloom from your garden
8. Three pansy or viola flowers floating in a saucer of water
9. FIRST-TIME ENTRANTS ONLY: Three blooms from your garden.

Indoor Plants:

10. Flowering indoor pot plant. Max. pot size 30cm (outside top edges)
11. Cactus or succulent. Max. pot size 25cm (outside top edges)

Flower Arrangements

12. Arrangement of flowers and foliage from your own garden. Max size 45x45x45cm. *Public Vote*

Produce grown by the Exhibitor

13. A single vegetable of any variety
14. Four tomatoes
15. Four vegetables of the same variety
16. Four vegetables, mixed varieties
17. A vase of edible flowers and herbs
18. A plate of six soft fruit (mixed or one type)
Retain stalks on raspberries and calyx on strawberries
19. Three sticks of rhubarb
20. My disaster vegetable
21. FIRST-TIME ENTRANTS ONLY: Three vegetables. May be all the same or mixed
22. Miscellaneous. Home grown item. *Public Vote*

Craft

23. A embroidered item
24. knitted item
25. A crocheted item
26. Make a birthday card for a gardener

Photography

All photos should be flat mounted, taken by the exhibitor, not previously exhibited – max size 180mm x 130mm

27. A photograph of a flower
28. Enjoying the garden
29. A local view
30. A photograph of a horticultural theme

Cookery

31. A packet-mix cake
32. Six pieces of tray bake
33. A jar of jam
34. A jar of marmalade

Children's Classes (12 years and under only)

35. Flower arrangement in a jam-jar
36. Decorate a flower pot (max 15cm diameter across the top)
37. Illustrate your own poem on nature on an A4 sheet of paper
38. Four buns from a packet-mix

NB: Children may also enter any of the adult classes. If a Prize or Highly Commended is won, points will be awarded counting towards two overall Garden Token prizes – for age 10 and under, and for age 11 and over.

TROPHIES WILL BE AWARDED IN EACH OF THE FIRST THREE CATEGORIES
FOR THE MOST POINTS WON BY AN EXHIBITOR
The trophies may be kept for three months, then returned to the Society

INTER-FAMILY COMPETITION
